

Why Virtual Communion

Is Not Nearly Radical Enough

April 2nd, 2020 by The Rev. Dr. Paul R. Hinlicky who is the Tise Professor of Lutheran Studies at Roanoke College in Virginia where he previously held the Jordan-Trexler Professorship of Religion and Philosophy. He also teaches part-time for the Institute of Lutheran Theology. From September 1993 through May 1999, he taught at Comenius University, Bratislava, Slovakia. He is an ordained pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and has served several congregations throughout his career.

The congregational leadership is now in the process of gathering a steering group for re-engaging the congregation in public worship. This group will be responsible for reviewing guidelines and recommendations for re-engaging in-person gatherings at Sts. Peter and Paul, including groups and organizations that use the facility, and developing *a plan for proceeding safely* which will be recommended to the Congregation Council. When the Council has approved this plan and a date has been set to begin public worship, we will be requesting and expecting your assistance with implementing it.*---djl*
