THE HOLY TRINITY June 4th, 2023 ♣ 10:15 a.m.

Though the word "trinity" is not found in the Scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all." In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in Word and Sacraments, as we profess the Creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

RITE FOR AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

ELW, pages 234-237

Confirmation marks the completion of the congregation's program of confirmation ministry, a period of instruction in the Christian faith as confessed in the teachings of the Lutheran Church. Those who have completed this program were made members of the Church in Holy Baptism. Confirmation includes a public profession of the faith into which the candidates were baptized, thus underscoring God's action in their Baptism.

Presentation

Aidan Altavilla and Sebastian Myers have been instructed in the Christian faith and desire to make public affirmation of their Baptism.

The parents and confirmation instructors come forward to present the confirmands with the words, "We present Aidan and Sebastian for the Rite of Confirmation."

Our dear brothers in Christ, we rejoice that you now desire to make public profession of your faith and assume greater responsibility in the life of our Christian community and its mission in the world.

Renunciation of Evil

In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you members of his Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from his Word God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been nourished at his holy table and called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Now, therefore, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize... Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises?

R I do.

*Profession of Faith

The candidates make confession of their faith in the words of the Creed. The congregation may stand.

Do you believe in God the Father?

R I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

R I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

R I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen

*Prayers

Let us pray for Aidan and Sebastian who are affirming their Baptism, and for all the baptized everywhere:

That they may be redeemed from all evil and rescued from the way of sin and death: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

That the Holy Spirit may open their hearts to your grace and truth: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

That they may be kept in the faith and communion of your holy Church: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

That they may be sent into the world in witness to your love: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We pray for our sisters, brothers and friends who are hungry and thirsty, who need peace, who are persecuted, and all who need your healing touch, especially... Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We give thanks for all our faithful departed and the witness we see in their lives... Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Into your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Commitment

The congregation may be seated.

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear his Word and share in his supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

R I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Prayer of Blessing

Let us pray. Gracious Lord, through water and the Spirit you have made Aidan/Sebastian your own. You forgave him all his sins and brought him to newness of life. Continue to strengthen him with the Holy Spirit, and daily increase in him your gifts of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. **Amen**

Laying On of Hands

Each candidate kneels in turn while the presiding minister lays both hands on his head, signifying the gift of the Holy Spirit. The parents and instructors may extend their hands.

Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in Aidan/Sebastian the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm his faith, guide his life, empower him in his serving, give him patience in suffering, and bring him to everlasting life. **Amen**

The candidates exchange the Peace with the presiding minister and with other members of the congregation.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.





It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God. You reveal your glory as the glory of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: equal in majesty, undivided in splendor, one Lord, one God, ever to be adored in your eternal glory. And so, with all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:



*THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: Endless is your mercy and eternal your reign. You have filled all creation with light and life; heaven and earth are full of your glory.

We praise you for the grace shown to your people in every age: the promise to Israel, the rescue from Egypt, the gift of the promised land, the words of the prophets; and, at this end of all the ages, the gift of your Son, who proclaimed the good news in word and deed and was obedient to your will, even to giving his life.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Therefore, O God, with this bread and cup we remember the life our Lord offered for us. And, believing the witness of his resurrection, we await his coming in power to share with us the great and promised feast. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Send now, we pray, your Holy Spirit, that we who share in Christ's body and blood may live to the praise of your glory and receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.

Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.

Join our prayers with those of your servants of every time and every place, and unite them with the ceaseless petitions of our great high priest until he comes as victorious Lord of all.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. Amen



UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

*Justin, martyr at Rome, died around 165 Thursday, June 1*st

Born of pagan parents, Justin was influenced by an elderly Christian in Ephesus. He became a teacher of philosophy and the Christian faith. Jailed for practicing an unauthorized religion, he refused to renounce his faith and was beheaded.

The Martyrs of Uganda, died 1886 Saturday, June 3rd

On June 3, 1886, thirty-two young men were burned to death for refusing to renounce Christianity. The confident manner in which these Christians went to their deaths contributed to a much stronger Christian presence in Uganda.

John XXIII, Bishop of Rome, died 1963

Saturday, June 3rd

When elected pope, the former Angelo Roncalli was expected to be a short-term caretaker. He showed great spirit, though, and convened the Second Vatican Council which helped bring great changes to Roman Catholic and other churches.

Boniface, Bishop of Mainz, missionary to Germany, martyr, died 754 Monday, June 5th

Boniface was a native of England who became a Benedictine monk and was called to missionary work among the Vandal tribes of Germany. With fellow workers, he established churches and schools, and he also worked to reform the church.

Seattle, chief of the Duwamish Confederacy, died 1866 Wednesday, June 7th

Noah Seattle led a coalition of tribes, and convinced them to live peacefully with encroaching white settlers. When he became a Roman Catholic, he held morning and evening prayer with his tribe. The city of Seattle is named for him.

Columba, died 597; Aidan, died 651; Bede, died 735; renewers of the church Friday, June 9th

These three monks from the British Isles helped keep the light of learning alive during the Middle Ages. Columba founded three monasteries off the coast of Scotland. Aidan was a pastor who led people to works of charity. The Venerable Bede was a Bible translator, historian, and hymnwriter.

ADOPTED INTO THE TRINITY

We are children of God: the expression is so familiar as to lose its punch. Isn't everyone a child of God? Yes, absolutely, in the sense that God loves every single person with an infinite and abiding love. But today's readings use the idea of becoming a child of God in a different way. In baptism we become children of God in such a way that we share in Jesus' own relationship as Son of God. We get to call God "Abba" as Jesus did; the Spirit who bears us is the wind that blows through our lives as it did through Jesus' life. (To follow today's gospel it helps to know that "spirit" and "wind" are the same word in Greek!)

Jesus uses the image of being born anew, born from above, born of the Spirit in the water of baptism. Paul uses the image of being adopted, as a Roman man might adopt a favored slave, giving the slave the status of son or daughter and legal heir. Birth and adoption are completely equivalent metaphors here, conveying the same truth that through the Holy Spirit we are brought inside the life of the Trinity, made to share in Jesus' own relationship with the one who sent him. The Spirit gives birth to us, the Father adopts us, and we are children of God just as Jesus is God's Son. And just as Jesus was God's self-giving to the world, we as God's children are given to the world because God so loves the world.

We who are baptized live a Trinitarian life. The Spirit blows through you, and confidently cries "Abba!" in your voice, and you are sent as a "friend" of Jesus to suffer with a world in pain and to be raised from every death by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Back in the fall of 2020, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America released *All Creation Sings (ACS)*, a hymnal supplement that goes hand in hand with *Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW)* to support the church's mission of worship in Word and Sacraments that leads to service and justice in the world. *ACS* invites us to expand our song and prayer with timely attention to the health of our planetary home and the human community within it. Included are 200 hymns and songs, more than 30 of them multilingual and many being new since *ELW* was released.

We have been downloading and including hymns from ACS in our worship bulletins as needed over the past several months; however, the formatting of the included hymns is difficult to read for many of our members. The Worship and Music Committee has recommended we purchase pew editions of ACS to use in our services in conjunction with ELW.
