#### **UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS**

## Francis of Assisi, renewer of the church, died 1226 Wednesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>

Born into the family of a wealthy merchant, Francis gave up his inheritance to serve poor people. He formed the Order of Friars Minor (called Franciscans), who took on poverty and the task of preaching "using words if necessary." Francis had a spirit of gratitude for all of God's creation.

## Theodor Fliedner, renewer of society, died 1864 Wednesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>

Fliedner helped to bring about a revival of the ministry of deaconesses among Lutherans. He was influenced in this by Moravian deaconesses he had met. The motherhouse he founded in Kaiserswerth, Germany, inspired many around the world to take up this ministry.

## William Tyndale, translator, martyr, died 1536 Friday, October 6<sup>th</sup>

Tyndale was ordained a priest in England, and wished to translate the Bible into English. He was opposed in this by King Henry VIII, causing him to flee to Germany. He completed the New Testament in 1525, but before he could finish the Old Testament, he was tried for heresy and burned at the stake.

## Henry Melchior Muhlenberg, pastor in North America, died 1787 Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup>

Divided Lutherans in America asked leaders in Europe to send someone who could take charge and unite their work. Muhlenberg was sent, and was effective in organizing the American Lutherans. Among other accomplishments, his liturgical principles became the basis for the Common Service of 1888.



#### Do

In order to better understand the very first question asked by the chief priests and elders in today's gospel—"By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" (Matt. 21:23)—it will help to review what "these things" are. "These things" include: Jesus entering Jerusalem on a donkey to wild reception by the crowd; Jesus overturning the money changers' tables in the temple; healing people who are blind and lame; offering interpretation of his actions based on scripture; and withering an unproductive fig tree.

This is a lot of action for one chapter of Matthew, but it is almost essential background information in order to hear today's gospel well. Jesus is a man on the move, a man of action, a man who fits his teaching in among his healing, withering, donkey riding, and more.

In context, his teaching and debate with the religious leaders makes much more sense. They want to quiz him, but when they are unable to answer a question, he decides not to answer because they are indecisive. Essentially he is saying, "I am not going to do your own hard work for you." Then he offers a parable that is simple to explain, even while it is paradoxical. Those who do God's will are those who do God's will, not those who promise to do it but then don't actually do it.

Certainly, even speaking and questioning is a certain kind of doing. But there are spoken deeds that include follow-through, and other speech acts that are simply blowing smoke. The good news is that when you find yourself simply doing even that which you had verbally resisted, that is the Spirit alive in you, going and doing what Jesus would have done.
