FIRST READING Isaiah 9:2-7

This poem promises deliverance from Assyrian oppression, a hope based on the birth of a royal child with a name full of promise. While Judah's king will practice justice and righteousness, the real basis for faith lies in God's passion for the people.

*GOSPEL READING

Luke 2:1-14

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke... Glory to you, O Lord.

God's greatest gift comes as a baby in a manger. Angels announce the "good news of great joy" and proclaim God's blessing of peace.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"



*Offertory Prayer



HOLY NIGHT



Thousands upon thousands of candles will be lit tonight in worship, remembering that silent night when our Lord was born. Each candle, whether held by a nine-year-old or a ninety-year-old, will reflect a prayer for hope: Hope that life will be what it is promised to be in Baptism, in the Lord's Supper, in the best of times the community of Christ is gathered. Hope that forgiveness in Christ will wash away the pain of broken relationships, broken hearts, broken lives. Hope that by Jesus' cross and

resurrection, death will truly be no more. Hope that through him, illness will grow into health. Hope that through him, love will overcome hate, goodness will indeed triumph over evil, poverty and hunger will one day end.

Raise your candle high tonight! Look around and see all the light around you, ahead of you, behind you. It's more than a sentimental evening, made up of memories of Christmases past. It's the stuff of life and death going on here. For all that is promised in Christ is given in him. When he promises in baptism that you will be made new, he gives what he says. Your own life will bear witness to this transforming love! When he promises in the Supper that you are forgiven, the sin that would weigh you down is removed. When Christ promises to be in the midst of even two or three who gather in his name, whether they are experiencing joy or sorrow, he is there, renewing community, giving community, birthing community. Look at the light you hold. The candle in your hand bears witness to the One who opens the future for you and for the world itself. It is a holy night. We are not left to ourselves. The Savior is here, in the child of this night.
