*PEACE


The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.



*THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

Reveal yourself to us in the breaking of the bread. Raise us up as the body of Christ for the world. Breathe new life into us. Send us forth, burning with justice, peace, and love. **Come, Holy Spirit.**

With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. **Amen**



UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Anselm, Bishop of Canterbury, died 1109 Sunday, April 21st

This eleventh-century monk was one of the greatest theologians of the Middle Ages. He is remembered for emphasizing the maternal aspects of God, and for the theory that the Son of God became human in order to make the necessary payment for our sin.

Day of the Creation (Día de la Creación) (LLC) Monday, April 22nd


This observance invites us to notice and give God thanks for the wonders of the created universe. As stewards of that creation, we are also challenged to be careful in our use of it.

Toyohiko Kagawa, renewer of society, died 1960 Tuesday, April 23rd

Born in Kobe, Japan, Kagawa was orphaned as a young child. Later, when he became Christian, he was disowned by the rest of his family. Wishing to bring Christian principles into society, he worked among poor people, established schools and hospitals, and worked for peace.

Mark, Evangelist Thursday, April 25th

He was not numbered among the twelve apostles, yet Mark was probably a member of the early church community. The gospel that bears his name is the shortest and most direct, and many scholars think it was the first to be written.



"We are always on our way from darkness into light..."

Some years ago in a homily at an Easter Dawn Mass in the ruins of the abbey at Cormomroe, County Clare, the late John O'Donohue said:

"We are always on our way from darkness into light. Every morning, we come out of the dark territories of dreaming into waking awareness of the day.

Every night, no matter how long, breaks again and the light of dawn comes. At birth each of us made a journey from darkness into light, from the warm secure darkness of the womb into the light of the world. So we are no strangers to darkness and we are special friends of the light...

"One of the beauties of Easter morning is that the light that comes with Christ is a gentle but penetrating light. There is no hurt anywhere within us no matter in what crevices it might be buried, but that the light of Easter can reach it and heal it...

"So on this Easter morning, let us look again at the lives we have been so generously given and let us let fall away the useless baggage we carry—old pains, old habits, old ways of seeing and feeling—and let us have the courage to begin again."
